Learning Objectives

During this workshop you will learn the techniques necessary to knit two socks at the same time on a circular needle. This not only helps to overcome 'second sock syndrome' but also helps you to produce two socks of the same size without endless counting of rows. You will come away with two baby socks, knitted from the cuff down.

Specific techniques that will be taught during the workshop:

How to cast two socks onto a circular needle	Long-tail cast on
How to knit socks on a circular needle	Magic loop
How to work a heel flap and gusset	
How to graft the toe	Kitchener stitch

Materials

Students will be provided with:

- A circular needle and sufficient yarn to make the baby socks
- A photo tutorial booklet
- Other equipment (e.g. darning needles, scissors) will be available for the duration of the workshop

Required Skills

Students must be able to knit and purl, count rows and stitches, work basic increases and decreases. Some previous experience of knitting socks would be helpful.

Students will have the opportunity to purchase Wool Zone sock yarns and kits at the workshop, but there is no obligation
